Information Sheet - The Growing Friends

The primary purpose of the group is to propagate and raise unusual plants, plants from the Royal Botanic Gardens and plants not readily available in commercial nurseries, and to sell these to the general public in support of the RGB. Linked to this main purpose is a desire to promote gardening, and the RBG in particular.

We are a small group of about 35 members, our number limited by the space in which we work. We welcome new members but because of the cap in numbers, there is a waiting list.

Joining the Growing Friends is a significant commitment. There is an expectation that volunteers work in the nursery each Friday morning for at least 4 hours, and also commit to work at the two major public plant sales which occur over a weekend in both autumn and spring. Regular attendance (subject to holidays, illness) and a commitment to the group are important. The nature of the work in the nursery requires a moderate level of fitness and agility as much of the activity is manual.
